

# Paper Chain Countdown to Christmas



## You will need the following supplies from home:

- tape or glue; scissors
- marker or crayon (You **may** need a permanent marker, if you print the paper strips.)
- construction paper cut into 1 inch X 6 inch strips (or print the paper strip template)
- sticker (optional)

## Instructions:

1. Look at the picture of the sample before you start your project. Colors may vary.
2. Write one date on each of your paper strips. (See below.)

1 <sup>st</sup> paper strip – Dec. 14	7 <sup>th</sup> paper strip – Dec. 20
2 <sup>nd</sup> paper strip – Dec. 15	8 <sup>th</sup> paper strip – Dec. 21
3 <sup>rd</sup> paper strip – Dec. 16	9 <sup>th</sup> paper strip – Dec. 22
4 <sup>th</sup> paper strip – Dec. 17	10 <sup>th</sup> paper strip – Dec. 23
5 <sup>th</sup> paper strip – Dec. 18	11 <sup>th</sup> paper strip – Dec. 24
6 <sup>th</sup> paper strip – Dec. 19	12 <sup>th</sup> paper strip – Dec. 25
3. Glue (or tape) the ends of the 1<sup>st</sup> paper strip together to make a ring.
4. Insert the 2<sup>nd</sup> paper strip inside the 1<sup>st</sup> ring, make a circle, and glue (or tape) the two ends together.
5. Continue the same process with the rest of the paper strips. NOTE: As you are putting the chain together, be careful to position the strips so that all the writing is going in the same direction. (See sample.)
6. If you like, attach a sticker to the link marked, “Dec. 25.”
7. Now use your paper chain as an Advent calendar. On Dec. 14<sup>th</sup>, rip off the link marked with that date. On Dec. 15<sup>th</sup>, rip off the next chain. Continue doing this each day.

## Historical Background:

We combined two Christmas traditions: paper chains and Advent calendars. Paper chains have long been used as Christmas decorations for trees and rooms. Advent calendars, like Christmas trees, are a tradition adopted from Germany. The first documented Advent calendar dates to 1851.

Other Ideas: Make a long chain and decorate your tree or room. Ask an adult first.
